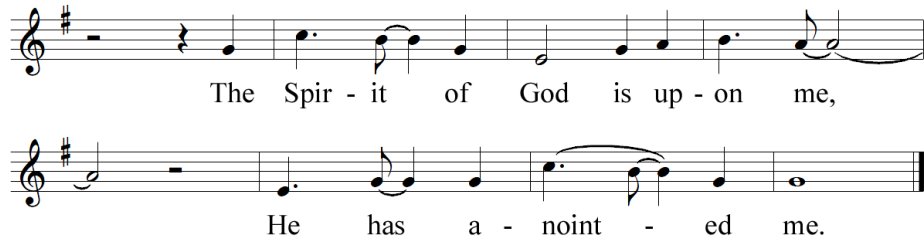

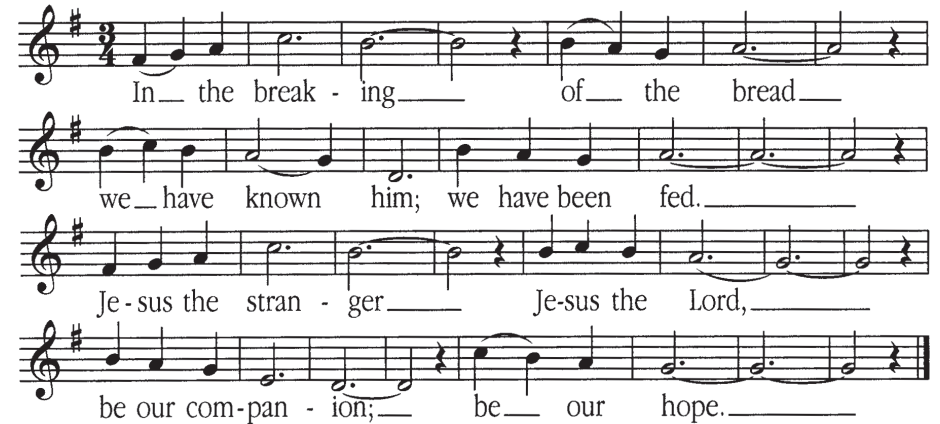
## COMMUNION RITE
